Dear ARMites of Chapter 22,

Summer is almost complete and the kids are back in school. The Toronto Star published the editorial cartoon on Labour Day weekend. If you missed it, look to the right. WHAT DID YOU DO??

The Federation was busy both locally and provincially negotiating a new collective agreement with the Government and School Boards. Late in August, OSSTF announced a "pathway" to a collective agreement. As he has done in the past, the Minister announced that a new collective agreement had been reached and only needed the approval of the membership. THIS IS NOT THE CASE! What has been agreed to is a possible pathway to an agreement. Both sides will continue to meet and attempt to resolve their differences and if they do on or before October 27, that tentative agreement will be voted on by the membership. If they do not, then any outstanding issues will be given to a 3member arbitration board who will decide on all matters. If there are issues that the two sides can agree upon between now and the end of October, those will not be placed before the arbiter, but will be in the 2022-2026 collective agreement. As well (and this may apply to you if you retired after June 2019) there is a remedy to Bill 124 (the marvellous 1% restriction on



salary & benefits). As of September 1, 2019 an additional 0.75% will be applied to all compensation. As of September 2020, a second 0.75% will be applied to the grid and other monetary allowances. The sides were not able to agree on a remedy for the 2021-2022 school year, but have agreed to submit the decision to an arbitration board (again 3-person, and I believe chaired by the same William Kaplan). They did agree that the arbitrators must come up with an amount between 1.5% and 3.25%. So, if you retired in the last 4 years, you should have some retroactive pay owing. School Boards will be charged with getting that to you, once the arbitration happens. (I believe they have 120 days following the announcement to get it to you. Stay tuned; I may have more info next time.) ACTIVE members are encouraged to vote by logging in to the Member Login at <a href="https://www.osstf.on.ca">www.osstf.on.ca</a>. Voting closes at noon on September 27.

You should also have seen that Ontario Labour and the Ontario Health Coalition are planning a rally at Queen's Park on Monday, September 25 at noon. This is the day that the Legislature resumes sitting following its Summer Vacation. (I have never understood why politicians criticize the teaching profession for its holidays – the legislature rose in early June and returns in late September, but I suppose that anybody can teach. HA HA!! I've been told that the boards are so in need of occasional teachers that students who are in their second year of teachers' college can apply and get a job. Well, imho, they will certainly learn more in schools than in an academic session.)

We have usually done our garden cleanup on the six-month anniversary of Earth Day; this autumn, it falls on a Sunday, and I don't work Sundays. So, since October 18 is International Persons Day, I thought it fitting to do our garden cleanup then. Come with your secateurs, lopping shears, and containers so that we can move much of the summer growth to the compost bin. I think we will need to wait until next year to have some compost to return to the garden, but the group can decide.

Next week I am off to ARM Council for Thursday and Friday; remember at the Biennial we tasked ARM Council with forming a workgroup to review ARM goals and membership. I anticipate forming that workgroup at the meeting. Also Council will be working on a survey of Home Care in Ontario. I expect to have something to share with you (most likely via email so if you are not receiving my "meeting" reminders, I don't have yours and you should send it to me) related to that.
